Fortunately, we have an excellent local Football Federation. And our Federation is well placed to look to the ASEAN Football Federation to support us with the development of the game.

Ladies and gentlemen

Football is more than a game – it should also play a role in the promotion of friendship and solidarity in our region.

This Council Meeting is a good example – it has brought together people from our regional neighbours. In doing so, it plays a role in promoting peace, respect and community in our region.

Our hosting of this Council Meeting is also, of course, an expression of our commitment to be a part of the ASEAN community.

As part of South East Asia, we share ASEAN's aim to foster economic growth, social and cultural development and regional peace and stability.
