This is not just about physical structures — it is about creating the foundation for economic transformation and ensuring that all Timorese, regardless of where they live, have access to essential services and opportunities.






Key initiatives include:

The strategy is based on three main axes: planning and restructuring the sector, strengthening management and inspection, and strategic investment in basic infrastructure.

The implementation of these measures is fundamental to reducing regional inequalities, improving the population's quality of life, and ensuring sustainable economic growth.






Excellencies, distinguished guests,

SUMMARY OF THE GOVERNMENT'S PROGRAMME FOR INFRASTRUCTURE

The 9th Constitutional Government defines infrastructure development as an essential pillar of the Strategic Development Plan, recognising its importance for the economy, job creation and private sector growth.


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Main Goals and Guidelines:

1. Infrastructure Governance and Management

 Detailed survey of existing infrastructure and ongoing projects for reassessment and correction.





- More efficient management of available funds, focusing on transparency and sustainability.
- Strengthen institutional capacities to monitor, inspect and supervise projects.
- Greater involvement of the private sector and Timorese labour in infrastructure development.

2. Road Network

- Construction, rehabilitation and maintenance of national, municipal and rural roads, following international quality and safety standards.
- Implementation of the Master Plan and Strategic Investment for Rural Roads.
- Continuous monitoring of road conditions and reinforcement of bridge and drainage infrastructure for flood control.

3. Water and Basic Sanitation

 Expanding access to drinking water and basic sanitation throughout the country.





- Construction of sewerage and drainage systems to reduce health and environmental risks.
- Development of strategic policies and plans for the sustainable management of water resources.

4. Energy

- Expansion of national power grid, guaranteeing 24-hour power supply to all regions.
- Restructuring the electricity sector to improve efficiency and financial sustainability.
- Diversification of energy sources, focusing on renewable energies, including hydroelectric, wind, solar and biomass.
- Exploring the potential of natural gas as an alternative to liquid fuels.

Implementing these measures aims to reduce regional inequalities, improve the population's quality of life, and guarantee sustainable economic growth.
